PLANNING YOUR FINANCES

Find out about your options for funding a taught or research degree and get top tips from our students.

At York you'll benefit from excellent teaching, outstanding facilities, and a dynamic environment to develop and learn.

This guide will help you break down any financial barriers and plan your route to York.



WHERE TO START

Find out your fees

Tuition fees cover the cost of your study with us and can vary by course.

Make a budget

Take time to consider what your costs will be and how you'll meet them. Our living costs guides will help you with this at york.ac.uk/pg-money.

Check funding deadlines

Start researching your funding options a year before applying to a course. To be eligible for funding you normally need to hold an offer of study.

Consider part-time study

You can study part-time for some of our taught and research degrees, enabling you to balance other commitments while studying.

Keep looking

If you miss a specific studentship funding deadline, keep looking as other opportunities may become available throughout the year. They are advertised on department web pages.

Create a budget

Make a weekly budget including food, transport, going out, etc, and try to stick to it. It's not easy and you might slip up at the beginning, but in the long run you'll save lots of money.

Get a part-time job

I work part-time at the University as a Student Ambassador and that suits my schedule quite well. I can pick and choose my hours and do more during the holidays.

Plan your food and drink

There are lots of ways to save money through changing your food and drink habits. Making your own packed lunch each day can save huge amounts of money. I would also recommend taking your own coffee and tea bags to the library - there's a hot water dispenser so you can make your own hot drinks.

From scholarships to loans, there are various options to help you fund your studies. But remember, apply as early as possible.

Postgraduate taught students


A number of subject-specific scholarships are on offer at York, as well as scholarships funded by generous donations from our alumni. You could also be eligible for a Government Masters Loan to help fund your studies.

York Graduate Loyalty Discount

If you've completed an undergraduate degree at York you could be eligible for a ten per cent fee discount for postgraduate taught courses.

Postgraduate research students

We offer an impressive range of Research Council funding and studentships at York. You can find funding through our research centres, major research units and Doctoral Training Programmes. There are also a number of subject-specific scholarships on offer at York. You could be eligible for a Government Doctoral Loan to help fund your postgraduate studies. There are also Government Masters Loans available to MPhil or MA/MSc by Research students.

If you experience financial difficulties, there is financial support which you can apply for through the Student Hub. When I applied, the advisers were kind and helped me complete the application.


Find an internship

There are a number of paid internship opportunities advertised by the University. I applied for an internship and worked on a short research project running focus groups with York students. This meant I had a little extra cash over the summer and some research experience to add to my CV.

Become a Graduate Teaching Assistant

As a Graduate Teaching Assistant I taught three seminars per week during term time. This experience has been invaluable and has helped me to secure part-time lecturing in my department.

If you're a UK student, you may be eligible for Disabled Students' Allowances (DSAs). DSAs are grants that can contribute towards some of the additional costs of studying at university with a disability or long-term health condition.
